Who Can Participate?

Certain classes may be restricted by grade level. Talk to your high school counselor for more information about Dual Enrollment, available courses, and applying.

How Do I Enroll?

Your high school will distribute Dual Enrollment information, including instructions on applying for admission, testing requirements, and registration forms. Again, your high school counselor will be able to give you more information.

How Much is Tuition?

Currently, at \$85 per credit hour, our tuition is among the lowest you'll find. It's a fantastic value and can save you tens of thousands of dollars over the course of earning a degree. You may qualify for a Dual Enrollment grant or other tuition assistance based on financial need.
